In celebration of Women's History Month, the Paso Robles City Library at 1000 Spring Street, invites the public to meet a local woman author every Saturday in March, 1:00-3:00pm.

On March 5, meet Juddi Morris, author of *The Harvey Girls* and most recently, *Tending the Fire*, a story about Maria Martinez, a Native American potter who revived the ancient art of pottery making among the women of her pueblo outside Santa Fe.

On March 12, meet Elizabeth Van Steenwyk, author of 70 books for young people, many inspired by her love for American history, including her most recent title, *Abraham Lincoln: A Prairie Life*, published for the bicentennial of his birth.

On March 19, meet Barbara Partridge, author of *Rocking the Cradle of Liberty*, a fascinating and unpredictable story of a young man's experience with life-changing events during the times in which he lived, including the American Civil War.

On March 26, meet Lori Paris, author of two Boots Beaumont mysteries—*Evil Exchange*, a chilling novel that exposes the dark side of adoption and *Fatal Flight*, a novel about industrial espionage, trafficking of innocents, and the human condition.
